An American aviator, lobbyist, teacher, and civil rights activist. She was the first African American woman to earn a private & commercial license in the United States, the first African American woman to run for the United States Congress, first African American officer in the Civil Air Patrol, and first woman in the U.S. to hold both a pilot's license and an aircraft mechanic's license. Additionally, she co-founded the first private flight training academy owned and operated by African Americans. Many of the pilots she trained went on to become Tuskegee Airmen.
